

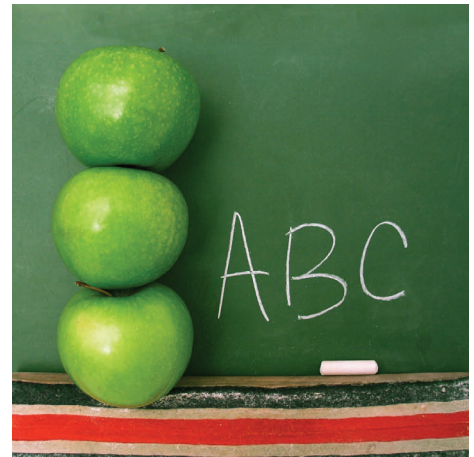
## Important Change To November 2, 2010 Ballot Referendum Timeline

If your School District is considering a public question referendum for the November 2, 2010 election, be advised that Public Act 96-1008 changed the time line for placing the question on the ballot. The Public Act requires that a resolution authorizing a binding question to be placed on the ballot be adopted at least seventy-nine (79) days prior to the election, rather than the previously permitted sixty-five (65) days. Therefore, in order to have a binding referendum on the November 2, 2010 election your School District must have the resolution approved by **August 16, 2010**.

The timeline for advisory referenda, initiated by citizen petitions, was also changed. Such referenda must be filed within ninety-two (92) days prior to the election. Therefore, a referendum initiated by voter petition must be on file by **August 2, 2010**.
